

## SAFE MEDICATION DISPOSAL







## START HERE

Follow the yes and no arrows to see how to best dispose your medication.

These steps

DO NOT apply to

inhalers or aerosols.

**Contact your trash** 

and recycling facility

to inquire about

proper disposal of

Are there specific disposal instructions from your healthcare provider or on your prescription labeling?

Is it a sharp?

"Sharps" are devices with sharp points or edges that can puncture or cut skin (ex. needle, syringe, lancet).

Can you bring it to a medication take-back location or do you have a drug mail-back envelope?

Is the medication on the FDA flush list?

Follow the FDA instructions below to dispose medication in household trash.

Put used sharps into a FDAapproved sharps container or a heavy-duty plastic container (ex. laundry detergent bottle). Bottle should be sturdy, leakproof, and puncture-resistant.

- 2 Label the container "Do Not Recycle - Contains Sharps."
- When the container is 3/4 full, seal the container.
- Dispose the container at a community sharps disposal program.

Dispose the container in household trash (NOT IN RECYCLING).

flush sharps down the toilet. **Never throw loose** harps in recycling or household trash.

DO NOT reuse sharps disposal containers.



1 Locate a take-back location.





- Bring medication to take-back location.



Drug mail-back envelopes can be purchased. Check your pharmacy, some may offer them at no cost.

- 1 Fill the drug mail-back envelope with the medicine.
- 2 Seal the envelope.

- Dispose it by immediately flushing it down the toilet.

This helps keep everyone in your house safe.

The medications on the FDA Flush List may be especially harmful, even fatal, when taken inappropriately and/or without prescription. They are often sought-after for their misuse and abuse potential.


> If your medication is not on the **FDA Flush List** DO NOT flush it down the toilet.





Scratch out all personal information from the medication bottle and packaging.
